In 2023, a special committee also worked on updating our bylaws. The committee did a complete review, including the duties and responsibilities of the board and committees, and ensured that a good system of accountability is in place.

A selection committee has been appointed, the position description has been updated, and work has begun to find the next leader who will serve you, our members, in this role. 


> Dedicated Projects are those that, through board action and donor direction, are funded every year. On an annual basis, 5% of the corpus of the accounts is distributed. For calendar year 2023, the total distributed was **\$439,381**.



Caring Ministries

This fund provides resources for Stephen Ministry and other care programs.

Amount distributed: \$22,611

Church Beautification

The funds in this account are used by the Church Beautification Committee to assist with seasonal decorations as well as improvements to the church grounds.

Amount distributed: \$722

Church Maintenance - Capital Improvement

This account has been established to help maintain and improve our properties. The funds are used for ongoing maintenance or for projects that improve our facilities.

Amount distributed: \$4,636

Communications - Broadcast Media

This account helps support the broadcast of our services on cable television and via the internet as well as other media formats.

Amount distributed: \$24,923

Early Childhood Student Aid

This fund was established to assist families with students attending our St. Lorenz Early Childhood and Childcare programs with tuition and fee expenses.

Amount distributed: \$2,594

Educational Enhancement Fund

This fund was established to assist our called workers with ongoing educational experiences. The fund provides resources for continuing education opportunities to enrich a worker's professional experiences and to support their teaching and preaching activities.

Amount distributed: \$60,176

Health Insurance Support

The cost of health insurance continues to climb. This account was established to provide support for retired pastors and teachers.

Amount distributed: \$397

Heritage Committee

Established in 2023 via a generous donation, this account provides funds for our Heritage Committee in support of its coordination of our museum and other historical projects.

Amount distributed: \$3,269

Missions

Two donor-designated accounts provide funding for mission work. The funds support a variety of mission programs and projects, and the Foundation Board of Directors has committed to helping build the account for mission projects. The congregation submits grant requests for missions, and the board selects and awards the grants.

Amount distributed: \$36,583

Music Fund

This fund was established to support music ministries at St. Lorenz.

Amount distributed: \$364

Operating Fund

This account provides funds annually to the Church Operating Fund. This account was established by a donor-directed gift and has been added to by others.

Amount distributed: \$23,509

Pastoral Ministry

Two dedicated accounts have been established to support pastoral ministry at St. Lorenz. Through a generous gift, the Board of Directors established the Pastoral Endowment. This fund provides resources on an annual basis to assist the congregation with expenses related to the pastoral team. The second account providing support for the pastoral ministry is the Vicar Endowment, which has been established to support the expenses of the Vicar Program.

Amounts distributed: \$156,924 (Pastoral Endowment) and \$52,040 (Vicar Endowment)

St. Lorenz School Family Aid

This fund was established to assist families with students attending our St. Lorenz School with tuition and fee expenses. The support needed is calculated through the FACTS program and administered by our school principal.

Amount distributed: \$16,067

St. Lorenz School Operations

Established in 2023, this account was created to assist with the operational costs of St. Lorenz School.

Amount distributed: \$295

Student Aid

This account was established to provide assistance for those preparing for ministry by attending one of our seminaries or universities. A number of families have contributed to this fund.

Amount distributed: \$34,271

> **Grant-Funded Projects** are those that are funded by the Foundation's Board of Directors based on grant requests from St. Lorenz Lutheran Church and School as submitted by individual commissions; by the Ministry Council; or by the congregation's Executive Director, Principal or Administrative Pastor. Twice a year, these grant requests are processed by the Planned Giving and Estate Planning Committee and forwarded to the board for action. For 2023, the board approved 34 new grants¹, with a total distribution of \$404,925².

Bethesda Ministry Support

Grants to support a St. Lorenz Task Force and short-term operational costs during a transitional period for Bethesda Ministry in Frankenmuth as the ministry owner, AbleLight, seeks a change.

Amount granted: \$35,000

Childcare Foodservice Equipment

Grant to purchase new plates, bowls and silverware for the Childcare program.

Amount granted: \$5,000

Church Doors

Grant to add five new doors to the church's access control system, improving security during church services.

Amount granted: \$8,500



Connection Coordinator

Grant to fund a staff position that provides training and support to volunteers for Connect services and other related activities held in the Worship and Event Center, as well as support for member assimilation.

Amount granted: \$15,000

Core Virtual Server Update

Grant to update the core servers that provide processing for all data functions at the church and school.

Amount granted: \$9,000

Director of Worship Arts Calling Expenses

Grant to fund the process of interviewing and selecting a new Director of Worship Arts to replace Bobby Cody, who accepted a call to Concordia University in Seward, Nebraska.

Amount granted: \$10,000

Early Childhood and Childcare Professional Development

Grant to provide professional development opportunities for those serving in our Early Childhood and Childcare programs.

Amount granted: \$10,000

Early Childhood, Infant and Toddler Playground Updates

Grant to purchase new equipment and playground turf for the playground used by our Early Childhood programs.

Amount granted: \$33,250

Early Childhood Playground Tricycle Replacement

Grant to repair or replace the Early Childhood program's playground tricycles as needed.

Amount granted: \$7,500

¹A number of these projects received only partial funding from the Foundation; the balance required to complete those projects was provided by either the Capital Improvement Fund or other SDU accounts.

²Included in this distribution is \$31,000 that previously was granted but was not needed for the approved projects. These reallocated funds remain with the congregation but are added to the amount for approved projects.

FACTS Online Registration for School

Grant to cover startup fees and provide support and training for the addition of online registration to our school's student management system.

Amount granted: \$6,000

Folding Machine for Church

Grant to purchase a new folding machine for use by the church office team and copy center volunteers.

Amount granted: \$3,000

Food Closet/Food Pantry

Grant for startup costs to establish a St. Lorenz food pantry for the community, located at The Rock.

Amount granted: \$10,000

Getting to Know 'Hardworking Holly'

Grant to fund the services of DKR Marketing in identifying the needs and opportunities for ministry to this audience.

Amount granted: \$12,000



Instruments for Volunteer Musicians

Grant to purchase musical instruments for use by our volunteer musicians.

Amount granted: \$3,000

Landscaping on Genesee Street

Grant to update the Genesee Street landscaping near the church offices.

Amount granted: \$11,000

LED Spotlights for Church Sanctuary

Grant to replace the spotlights in the chancel area of the sanctuary with LED lights.

Amount granted: \$6,250

Logo and Brand Implementation

Grant to support the creation and implementation of the new St. Lorenz logo artwork.

Amount granted: \$14,125

Mission Central Trip

Grant to send a team from St. Lorenz to Mission Central in Iowa to learn about the mission program and examine the potential to establish a similar program at St. Lorenz.

Amount granted: \$6,000

Motion Light Upgrade for School

Grant to install motion sensors in our school hallways to conserve energy and improve safety.

Amount granted: \$3,500

Office Space Update for Pastor Eden

Grant to update Pastor Eden's office furniture and workspace.

Amount granted: \$3,000



The Rock Audio/Visual Update

Grant to install six large-screen televisions and make updates to the sound system at The Rock, which is used by our Youth Ministry and a variety of other groups.

Amount granted: \$13,000



The Rock Bathroom Update

Grant to purchase new equipment for the bathrooms at The Rock and to help support its installation by volunteers.

Amount granted: \$6,000

The Rock Furniture Update

Grant to purchase some new furniture for The Rock to accommodate increased use of the facility by a wide variety of groups.

Amount granted: \$5,000





School Learning Center Air Conditioning Study

Grant to fund a professional study to determine whether the current air handlers can be used and whether the system has the required capacity.

Amount granted: \$3,600

School Learning Center Flooring/Furnishing Update

Grant to replace the tile in the Learning Center with carpet and to update some furnishings.

Amount granted: \$30,000

Soccer Field Shelter Study

Grant to study the need for and costs associated with a picnic shelter with bathrooms at the Mayer Road soccer fields located near the sanctuary.

Amount granted: \$2,500

Teacher Position for School

Grant to assist with the hiring of an additional teacher for our school, a position to begin with the 2024-25 school year. Due to increased enrollment and the needs of students, administration has identified the need for increased staffing.

Amount granted: \$75,000

Town Hall Meetings with Pastor Hubbard

Grant for supplies and refreshments for town hall meetings with Pastor Hubbard.

Amount granted: \$5,000

Volunteer Coordination and Recognition: Seen, Loved, Heard

Grant to provide funding for a volunteer coordinator for Traditional Service volunteers and to support volunteer recognition events.

Amount granted: \$10,100

Website Update

Grant to support the redesign of the St. Lorenz website, including all necessary graphics and page design.

Amount granted: \$15,000

Welcome Celebration for New Members

Grant to provide all new member families with a Lutheran Study Bible, to host a new member welcome dinner and to provide refreshments at welcome events.

Amount granted: \$5,100



Worship and Event Center Drum Sound Improvement

Grant to purchase an updated drum set and associated equipment for the Worship and Event Center.

Amount granted: \$15,000

Worship and Event Center Microphone Update

Grant to purchase new microphones for the Worship and Event Center, both to replace old units and to provide additional units.

Amount granted: \$3,500

Worship and Event Center Storage

Grant to purchase storage racks to make better use of the available storage space in the upper level of the Worship and Event Center.

Amount granted: \$5,000



Turning dollars into dreams fulfilled

The St. Lorenz Foundation exists to help members of our congregation make gifts that will support the mission and ministry of St. Lorenz Lutheran Church and School until Judgment Day.

Each year, as you read the Foundation's Annual Report, you see the many projects that have been awarded grants, as well as the dollars that have been distributed from the Foundation's Dedicated Funds. Those grants and distributions are the direct result of our congregation's generous gifts to the Foundation and the Foundation's thoughtful stewardship of those gifts.

Have you ever wondered where that money comes from and how the projects being funded by that money came into existence? Read on to learn more.

Humble roots

When the St. Lorenz Foundation formed in 1995, there was just one Foundation account: The General Fund, where any funds received during a calendar year were placed. Earnings from the year also were deposited into that account. And, once a year, 5% of that total was available for distribution in support of our church and school.


During the early years of the Foundation, St. Lorenz staff would make requests for those dollars, and the Foundation Board of Directors would award the grants – a very simple process that moved funds from the Foundation to the congregation to meet needs.

Today, we have both a General Fund that provides the funding for grants and a collection of Dedicated Funds that support specific areas of ministry as designated by donors. And the process of awarding grants from the General Fund has become more robust and strategic as we've grown.

The General Fund: Supporting grant requests from the congregation

Gifts to the Foundation that are not designated for a specific area of ministry are deposited to the General Fund. It is from the General Fund that the St. Lorenz Foundation Board of Directors awards grants based on requests from the congregation.

The flexibility of the General Fund and the thoughtful, thorough nature of the grant process help provide many blessings to St. Lorenz. In 2023, the Foundation distributed more than \$400,000 in support of Grant-Funded Projects. See pages 6 to 9 of this report to learn more about the 34 projects funded by these approved grants.



How does the grant process work?

The Foundation accepts grant requests *only* from within St. Lorenz Church and School. Grants are awarded twice per year through a five-step process:

1. Grant applications are received by the Foundation Executive Director and reviewed for accuracy. *See "Put your ideas on the table!" on page 12 to learn how to turn your idea into a formal grant application.*
2. The applications are distributed to the Foundation's Planned Giving and Estate Planning Committee and Board of Directors for review and rating. Ratings are compiled and then provided to all reviewers.
3. The Planned Giving and Estate Planning Committee reviews the grant requests and ratings and seeks to balance the available funds with the requests, preparing a recommendation for the Board of Directors.
4. The Board of Directors takes final action on the recommended grants.
5. Funds for the approved grants are distributed by the Foundation to the church and school. The congregation then disburses the funds and supervises the Grant-Funded Projects.

In all, approximately 20 individuals – mostly volunteers – are involved in the careful review of every grant request received by the Foundation. Their service is vital to the process, providing unique viewpoints and thoughtful consideration to ensure that Grant-Funded Projects are in harmony with the congregation's mission and ministry.

What kinds of projects does the Foundation support with grants?

To more directly link grant requests to the congregation's mission and goals, the Foundation Board of Directors has established a process by which the Administrative Pastor and Foundation Executive Director annually recommend to the board a targeted theme for the upcoming year's "call for grant requests."

For the 2024 granting cycle, the Foundation is seeking requests that support spiritually focused events. This could take many forms: A Bible class program, a guest speaker, a concert, a service project – whatever the congregation can dream up! *See "Put your ideas on the table!" on page 12 to learn more about how you can submit an idea for consideration.*

From grant request to reality

Since 1995, the Foundation has helped bring to life hundreds of ideas from the congregation through grants issued from the General Fund. Here are just a few examples of ideas that have gone from grant request to reality:

- Our **Commission on Worship** wanted to let members know about the many ministries that are active in our congregation. A grant from the Foundation funded the creation of the wonderful booklet that provides members with information about mission and ministry opportunities.
- Our **Pastors** wanted to bring a Vicar to St. Lorenz to learn from our Pastoral Team and to minister to our people. With a grant from the Foundation, the first Vicar was brought to St. Lorenz in 2004-05, ultimately leading to the establishment of the dedicated Vicar Fund. *See page 14 of this report for information about the 20 Vicars who have served our congregation.*
- Our **Prayer Committee** wanted to create a way for members to walk through the Churchgrove and meditate on God's rich, countless blessings. A Foundation grant led to the creation of our Prayer Trail that has been walked by many.
- Our **St. Lorenz School teachers** wanted to replace straight rows of desks with flexible seating. With a grant from the Foundation, a number of our classrooms are meeting student needs in a new and welcomed way.
- Our **Director of Buildings and Grounds** wanted to remove some trees that had reached maturity and provide new landscaping for our North Campus entry. With a grant from the Foundation, the new plantings are ready for spring 2024.

Put your ideas on the table!

Let's say you have an idea for a grant request from the General Fund. It's something you've been thinking about – something that one or more of the St. Lorenz groups you work with would be blessed by – and you'd like to see it considered. Here is the process:

- Formulate your idea – dream dreams and help identify needs. Think about what you want to do, how it can be done and how its success can be measured.
- Email Foundation Executive Director Perry Bresemann at pab@stlorenz.org and request a grant application form.
- Submit your application or idea for initial consideration in one of the following ways:
 - Complete the grant application form and share it with one of these St. Lorenz leaders: Administrative Pastor Brad Hubbard, Church Executive Director Jeremy Frank or School Principal Leah Knoll.
 - Complete the grant application form and share it with a member of one of our congregation's Commissions or with the St. Lorenz Ministry Council.
 - *For 2024 only:* If you have an idea for a spiritually focused event, complete the suggestion card included in this report and return it as directed on the card.

If you submit a formal grant application, the individual or group to which you submit your application for initial consideration will contact you if additional information is needed and will determine whether the request will be forwarded to the Foundation for review. *See "How does the grant process work?" on page 11 to learn about the review process for grant applications.* If you submit a suggestion card, a member of the Foundation team or church/school leadership will follow up to help you develop your idea into a formal grant application if your idea has the potential to be funded.

Dedicated Funds: Supporting specific areas of ministry

Over the years, individual members asked if they could direct the 5% distribution that would come from their gift to an area of ministry that they particularly wanted to support. The Foundation Board of Directors listened to our members and created what were referred to as "categories of gifts." Members were able to direct their gifts into one of the general categories that interested them.

Today, we refer to these designated categories as Dedicated Funds – and almost 50% of our annual distribution goes to these causes that have been identified by our donors. The Dedicated Funds are a great blessing to our congregation, supporting many ongoing needs. In 2023, the Foundation distributed approximately \$440,000 in Dedicated Funds to their respective projects. *See page 5 of this report to learn more about the 15 Dedicated Projects that received distributions – including some that were new in 2023.*

What do the Dedicated Funds support?

At this time, we have seven overarching categories of Dedicated Funds:

Church – This category currently includes the relatively new **Music Fund**, which supports our church music program, and the **Caring Ministries Fund**, which supports our Stephen Ministry and other Caring Ministry programs.

General Operations – Accounts in this category support a number of programs, including **Church Maintenance**, **Capital Improvements** and **Church Beautification**. This category also includes support for our ongoing **Communications – Broadcast Media** program, providing for the broadcast of our worship services on cable television and streaming via the internet. A new addition to this category is support for the work of the **Heritage Committee**.


Missions – These two accounts provide funding for **mission programs** approved by our congregation. The Foundation's Board of Directors currently is studying the policies that govern how these dollars are distributed; you will hear more about this in the future.

Pastoral Ministry – Providing support for our **Administrative Pastor** and for our **Vicar program**, these two accounts are used to offset salaries and benefit costs.

Professional Staff – This category supports our professional staff in two ways: The **Educational Enhancement Fund** provides resources for staff members to continue their education through coursework or travel experiences, and the **Health Insurance Support Fund** helps retired pastors and teachers pay for healthcare coverage.

St. Lorenz School – Three general areas of support for our school have been established. First, we want to ensure that any family that wants their child to attend our school can do so; scholarships and financial assistance are provided by grants from the

School Family Aid Fund. Similarly, the Early Childhood Student Aid Fund makes grants available for those attending our Early Childhood and Childcare programs. And the new **St. Lorenz School Operations Fund** assists with the operational costs of our school.



Student Aid – Accounts in this category provide college or seminary tuition support and post-graduation financial support for individuals pursuing careers in professional church work – whether they seek to become pastors, teachers, youth directors, directors of Christian education or deaconesses.

Are the existing Dedicated Funds the only ones available?

There is always room for more Dedicated Fund accounts to support specific areas of ministry for which St. Lorenz members feel called to provide. The needs of our church and school ministry are changing and evolving constantly. 
Ways to give

Feeling inspired and want to make a gift that can help turn dreams into reality? There are three ways to do so:

- **Designated gifts:** These are directed to the Dedicated Fund account in which you have a personal interest and feel called to support.
- **Undesignated gifts:** These are placed in the General Fund and used to award grants or to benefit areas of ministry that need it most.
- **Future gifts:** Planned giving options – such as wills, trusts, life insurance policies, annuities and stocks – are an opportunity to establish a permanent partnership with St. Lorenz, creating an enduring legacy. A planned gift counselor is available to answer questions about gifting options.
